Yorkshire Terriers are a long coated breed. Long coated dogs require extra collagen for hydration of the skin and coat. These products will hydrate your Yorkie's skin and coat and make it shine while leaving the texture of the coat intact. With regular bathing you will experience less matting and breakage and easier brush outs!

For best results, follow the Iv San Bernard bathing instructions sheet. Products should be diluted 1 part product to 3 parts water and allowed to sit on the dog for a full 5 mins before rinsing.
